Message from Father Paisius

Glory to Jesus Christ! Greetings to the faithful members and families of Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Parish Community. May the Lord our God continue to bless us all as we follow Him every day.

The 2nd Sunday of Great Lent we commemorated Saint Gregory Palmas, Archbishop of Thessaloniki in the 14th century. Saint Gregory defended the Church and its understanding of how we see and experience God. He taught that we see and experience the light of God in the energies but not the essence of the nature of God. He used the example from the created world of how we see the Sun by seeing the rays of sunlight but not seeing the Sun itself. By seeing the light of Christ as the disciples saw the Light of Christ shining on the Mount as celebrated in the Feast of Transfiguration, we are able to transformed and changed and can experience spiritual growth. This teaching of Saint Gregory Palmas is called Hesychasm and explains our understanding of God and how as Orthodox Christians we also can be transformed and grow in faith.

In the Gospel Reading, we learned about the importance of developing a deeper faithful that overcomes obstacles and allows God to work in our lives. Just as the friends of the Paralytic had a deep faith which resulted in his healing, so we are called to develop this same depth of faith so that we are able to experience the miraculous and healing power of God in our lives. This power can change and transform the limits of our humanity and help us be the children of God as were created to be.

Saints and Feasts Commemorated

Saint Gregory Palamas March 12



This divine Father, who was from Asia Minor, was from childhood reared in the royal court of Constantinople, where he was instructed in both religious and secular wisdom. Later, while still a youth, he left the imperial court and struggled in asceticism on Mount Athos, and in the Skete at Beroea. He spent some time in Thessalonica being treated for an illness that came from his harsh manner of life. He was present in Constantinople at the Council that was convened in 1341 against Barlaam of Calabria, and at the Council of 1347 against

Acindynus, who was of like mind with Barlaam; Barlaam and Acindynus claimed that the grace of God is created. At both these Councils, the Saint contended courageously for the true dogmas of the Church of Christ, teaching in particular that divine grace is not created, but is the uncreated energies of God which are poured forth throughout creation: otherwise it would be impossible, if grace were created, for man to have genuine communion with the uncreated God. In 1347 he was appointed Metropolitan of Thessalonica. He tended his flock in an apostolic manner for some twelve years, and wrote many books

and treatises on the most exalted doctrines of our Faith; and having lived for a total of sixty-three years, he reposed in the Lord in 1359.

Sunday of the Holy Cross March 19



With the help of God, we have almost reached the middle of the course of the Fast, where our strength has been worn down through abstinence, and the full difficulty of the labor set before us becomes apparent. Therefore our holy Mother, the Church of Christ, now brings to our help the all-holy Cross, the joy of the world, the strength of the faithful, the staff of the just, and the hope of sinners, so that by venerating it reverently, we might receive strength and grace to complete the divine struggle of the Fast.
